Continued Successes of 2021

I want to thank you for your generous support of Wayside Waifs during another challenging year. Because of your generosity, 2021 was a year of continued growth and new beginnings for Wayside.

This year we were able to fully utilize our new Education and Training Center, made possible by The Building Dreams and Transforming Lives Capital Campaign that was completed in 2020. The expansion has greatly expanded Wayside's impact. From new office spaces for our Humane Education department to greater availability of public training classes offered for owned animals – programming that is proving critical for pet ownership retention. The additional space has also been pivotal in spreading our reach through volunteer and staff training classes to even providing private event rental space opportunities for businesses and other community members.

Our new Canine Behavior Center, the second of its kind in the country, was the other major endeavor of The Building Dreams and Transforming Lives Capital Campaign. With the addition of the Canine Behavior Center, Wayside's Canine Behavior Modification Program is thriving. As predicted, the dedicated space has been a game changer for those dogs who need extra support in their journey to finding a forever home. With your support, Wayside was able to give customized behavioral support to 210 dogs at the Canine Behavior Center in 2021.

When called upon, Wayside's Animal Rescue and Response Team was there to help. In August 2021, Wayside's team rescued 57 dogs from deplorable conditions at a Louisiana puppy mill. A few months later in November, Wayside's team was called to help 142 dogs who were languishing at a large scale puppy mill in lowa. In both cases, many of the dogs suffered from various medical conditions and most were shy and fearful. Once safely at Wayside, our team was able to provide medical and behavioral care, nutritious food, and love. These dogs were given the second chance they deserve because of you.

The successes of 2021 could not have happened if it weren't for your support. The last couple of years have been trying and have held plenty of uncertainty, but your generosity was unwavering – and for that we are truly grateful.




Cornbread & The Stanley Family
